- 4. Has the District actively recruited school choice students for the Granville Village School in the same way they've done for the other schools?
 - Yes. School choice advertisements have been placed for Granville Village School in the same manner as the schools on the Southwick campus ever since Granville joined the District.
- 5. What will the average class size at Woodland and Powder Mill Schools be if Granville Village School is closed? How does that relate to capacity at those buildings?

- 6. If Granville Village School closes, how long will bus rides be for Granville students? Currently, students from Granville attending Granville Village School have an average bus ride of 43 minutes every morning and students from Granville attending the Regional School have an average bus ride of 44 minutes. It is anticipated the morning runs would increase marginally but not exceed an hour. Every attempt would be made to maintain runs similar in length to the Regional School times.
- 7. Did the School Committee commit to keeping the Granville Village School Open in the Regional Agreement?

There is no language in the regional agreement that suggests the school will remain open. In contrast, the language of the Regional Agreement specifically identifies the steps that need to be taken to close the school. - 8. Did the School Committee commit to putting a new roof on the Granville Village School during regionalization?
 - There is no documentation to support this assertion.
- 9. What capital improvement money has been spent on Granville Village School since regionalization?
 - Buses- When Granville joined Region, they contributed 4 buses and 1 van to the STRSD fleet. Over the past four years, all but 1 or 2 have failed to remain in service, resulting in accelerated vehicle replacement. Full size bus cost- about \$80,000
 - Technology- 2015-2016: approx. \$20,000.00

- 10. Will all the teachers and staff of the Granville Village School lose their jobs if the Granville Village School closes?

No. As District employees the teachers and staff of the Granville Village School are full members of their individual bargaining units regardless of their work location. Any reduction in workforce would be in accordance with bargaining unit contracts and is typically dictated by seniority which is determined by hire date.
